Course Description

- ◆ Classes will **begin on Monday morning of each week with orientation and classroom instruction in a centrally located site to be determined.**
- ◆ Classes will form into small groups with each group making a daily field trip to a pre-selected area business or industry.
- ◆ All groups will observe both the workers and the work process, and will interview business representatives to gather specific information about the business or industry.
- ◆ A written report from the group will be required for each business visit. **There are no tests!**
- ◆ Results will be edited and published in a community **Career Planning Guide**, which will be distributed to area schools, guidance departments and all participating teachers and employers.
- ◆ The guide provides a resource in which students can learn about employers of the area.
- ◆ Two credit course concludes on Friday with team reports and course evaluation.
- ◆ Participants taking 3 credits will have an individualized project and additional time to complete third credit work. The project will focus on the development and implementation of school-to-career transition in the classroom or district.
